

Example core aims and expected outcomes include:

- Self-awareness. To reflect on strengths and weaknesses of selves and others
- Negotiation. To help develop social communication skills
- Emotional resilience. To help develop resilience across a range of settings.
- Decision-making. To increase responsibility and care for others and themselves.
- Confidence and self-esteem. To support students in their views of self & ability.

The following activities being the mechanisms in which to achieve the above;

- Working with the animals; caring for others recognition and awareness of emotions and communication of them; reading, writing, mathematics; speaking and listening to adult-led instruction; exploration of career pathways.
- Green-woodworking creating something to be proud of; managing frustration; following instruction; reading, writing, mathematics.
- Gardening sensory-based activity for regulation; planning, preparation; growing and nurturing; caring for others
- Bushcraft and outdoor cooking; healthy eating; caring for others; problem solving; giving and following instruction (verbal and written)
